The sudden oak death (SOD) fungus was reported in an additional two Florida nurseries, for a total of five state nurseries infected. FDACS is working to control the problem.

**In addition, FDACS reports that residents report scams from "landscape companies" which will spray to protect trees and shrubs from SOD.**
